Budget Update

The 2025 Budget has been approved by Council for a projected blended rate increase of 3.39%. For a home valued at \$1,000,000 this is a tax increase of \$127. Staff has been working hard to keep tax increases to a minimum while still supporting the services expected by existing residents and expanding communities.
